Current Dublin Branch

- ▶ Built in 1980 with addition in 1990
- ▶ Current Square Footage: 20,147 sq. ft.
- ▶ Current Parking Spaces: 119
- ▶ Fourth busiest branch in system



New Dublin Branch

- ▶ Proposed Sq. Footage: 41,000 sq. ft.
- ▶ City/library parking garage project
- ▶ Will become one of our largest branches

Goal:

To establish a strong visual connection (or transition) between Dublin's historic identity and its dynamic future.

Designed and fully integrated as part of the entire civic space.

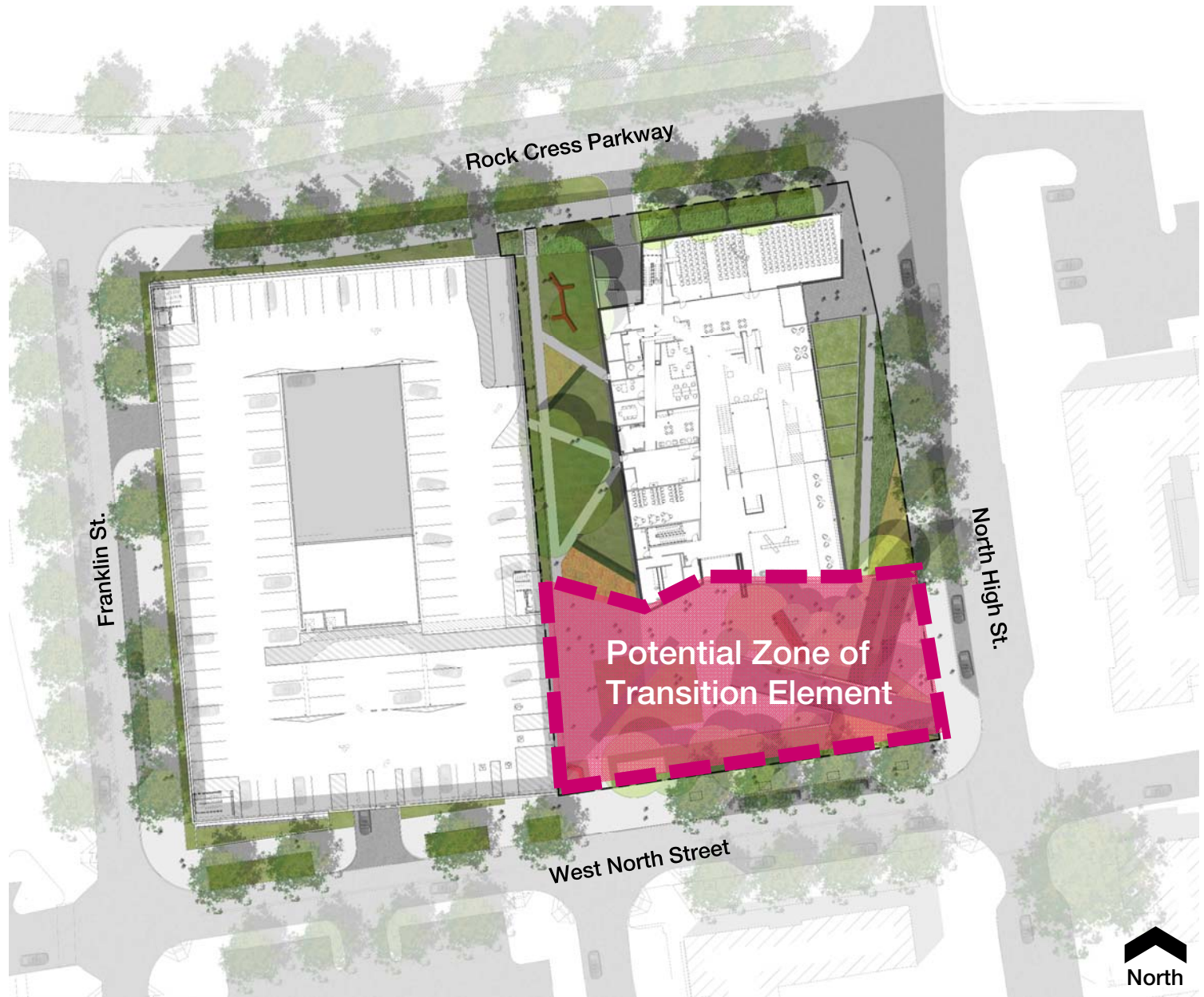
Enhances and helps advance the overall design concepts.

Process:

- This element will be developed with an advisory committee that will represent a mix of civic leaders, CML leadership and NBBJ.
- Public input will be gathered at the onset of the project during concept design and again for input once design team has more refined proposals
- Recommended schedule:
 - Week of April 24th: Advisory Committee Kickoff
 - Week of May 1st: Public Input Session
 - Week of July 10th: Public Input Session
 - Late August: Presentation of Final Site Plan to Council.
